New Zealand's most inland tidal lake at Waihola can be found in Clutha, with Sinclair Wetlands and Taieri Mouth nearby.



The Clutha Gold Cycling and Walking Trail, one of New Zealand's Great Rides takes you on a journey of discovery within a landscape of outstanding natural beauty

Ride or walk alongside the powerful Clutha (Mata-au) River through a fertile valley, secluded gorge and into lush green farmland.

Open all year round, this 73 kilometre Grade 2 (easy) trail passes through four settlements along the way - Roxburgh, Millers Flat, Beaumont and Lawrence. The trail can take between two and four days to complete, and is in the process of being extended from Lawrence through to Lake Waihola via Milton, keep an eye out for updates.

Day One: Lawrence and Gabriel's Gully

You haven't seen the South until you've seen Lawrence. Lawrence is the site of one of the world's largest and fastest ever gold rushes.

Optional Additional Itinerary: Clutha Gold Trail

The best way to truly soak up the rich heritage is to get out and about on the Clutha Gold Cycling and Walking Trail. You can start (or finish) the trail in Lawrence.

Day Two: Tuapeka Mouth, Kaka Point & Nugget Point Don't miss a trip on Clutha's free ferry, the Tuapeka Punt powered by the flow of the mighty Clutha River.

Kaka Point and Nugget Point - a picturesque seaside village at the Northern edge of The Catlins, famous for its surfing and spectacular scenery.


Day Three: The Catlins - Owaka and Surrounds

Cannibal and Surat Bay are renowned as some of the best places to see sea lions in The Catlins. Lush rainforest, spectacular valleys, white sandy beaches and a large tidal lake surround Catlins biggest town, Owaka.

Day Four: The Catlins - Papatowai to Curio Bay

Papatowai - enjoy the small settlement where forest meets the sea. En route to Curio Bay, don't miss Florence Hill Lookout, Cathedral Caves (seasonal), and McLean Falls.



Alternative inland roads provide a more direct path between the main centres, however the Southern Scenic Route is a journey that allows access to deserted beaches, lush rainforest, pristine lakes and stunning mountain vistas.
